Volusia County's Pet Vet Cruiser is a state-of-the-art mobile veterinary clinic for pet owners, who qualify, to have their pets surgically sterilized. Pet Vet Cruiser follows the income requirements for the Florida Free Lunch program in use by public school systems in Florida and other community services to determine for which program an individual qualifies. Residents must show proof at the check-in desk on surgery day.

A rabies vaccination will be given and a license issued for each animal that is not currently vaccinated and licensed. Proof of vaccination must be shown at the time of surgery if an animal is currently vaccinated.

Pet surgeries are performed in the morning. Drop off for pets is at 9 AM. Pets will be released to their owners the same afternoon. Call the appointment line at (386) 626-6643 to schedule; this is a DeLand number. Call-in times are between 10 AM to 3 PM Mondays through Fridays.

When you call, please have the following information ready: Name, address, phone numbers, total household income, pet(s) name, sex, breed, color, age, weight and any allergy and/or vaccination history. If your pet does not have a current rabies vaccination, the cost is \$5.00 for a vaccination and a County of Volusia license. ▶▶Please call (386) 626-6643 if you cannot keep your appointment.

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PROVISION OF FIRE SERVICES FOR THE CITY

Fire services are provided to DeBary by an agreement with Orange City. Orange City provides services via two (2) fire stations: 93 South Highway 17/92 (DEBARY STATION) and 743 Harley Strickland Blvd. (ORANGE CITY STATION). DEBARY STATION shall be staffed by three (3) firefighter personnel, consisting of one (1) Fire Officer I-Certified Shift Commander and two (2) Firefighter-EMTs, one of whom shall also be a Paramedic. ORANGE CITY STATION shall be staffed by two (2) firefighter personnel, consisting of one (1) Firefighter-EMT and one (1) Firefighter-Paramedic. Such staffing shall be provided twenty-four (24) hours each day for seven (7) days each week. Such staffing levels shall aid in maintaining the current Insurance Service Organization ("ISO") rating for DEBARY at 5/9.

Both DEBARY STATION and ORANGE CITY STATION shall provide Advanced Life Support ("ALS") services to DEBARY to the extent ORANGE CITY retains ALS capabilities.

When available, Orange City shall obtain and utilize Orange City and DeBary volunteer firefighters to enhance and maintain staffing levels, thereby increasing productivity and availability of services to DeBary.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT (386) 668-2040 ext 320 - Frequently-Asked Questions

Q: What do I do with the permit and associated documents after I pick them up at the Building Division? **A:** Post them on the job site where they are clearly visible and accessible for the building inspector to use during the inspection process. We suggest that you place the documents in a clear plastic (freezer) zip lock bag if they are to be posted outside!

Q: If I fail an inspection what do I do? **A:** If an inspection fails for work that does not lead to a Certificate of Completion or Certificate of Occupancy it will be necessary to pay the applicable re-inspection fee before the next inspection will be scheduled. This would apply to all inspections except new construction/additions where the re-inspection fees would be paid prior to release of the C of C or CO.

Q: Do I need a permit to do minor roof repair? **A:** Minor repairs, such as replacing a few shingles or repairing small sections of fascia, do not require a permit. In the event that you experience an emergency, such as a fallen tree limb damaging your roof, please make the necessary emergency repairs and apply for a building permit the following business day.

Q: Do I need a permit to remove a dead tree? **A:** You may not need a permit, but please contact the Building Department so that an inspection can be conducted. The Building Department can be reached at (386) 668-2040 ext 320.

Q: Do I need a permit to replace my driveway slab? **A: Yes.** You also will need to provide a current property survey showing the location of the existing/proposed driveway. The driveway will be required to have either a 6” x 6” welded wire or fiber mesh in the cement, a thickened edge at the street of at least 6” and the soil treated for termites where the slab comes within two (2) feet of the foundation of a structure.

Q: Do I need a permit to pour a patio slab? **A: Yes.** You also will need to provide a current property survey showing the location of the proposed patio slab with dimensions and property setbacks. The slab will be required to have either a 6” x 6” welded wire or fiber mesh in the cement and the soil treated for termites where the slab comes within two (2) feet of the foundation of a structure.

Q: Who do I need to contact if I have a complaint about my contractor? **A:** The Department of Business and Professional Regulation. Go to www.myflorida.com and click on *File a Complaint*.

Q: How long is my permit good for? **A:** The permit will expire after six (6) months if no inspections pass.

Outdoor Storage of Personal Property




Personal property means items that are normally stored inside whether it be in the home or in an enclosed garage. Yard items such as grills, swings, lawn chairs, etc., are to be stored in the rear yard.

Maintenance of Structures



All structures are to be maintained in sound working order. This includes your home as well as other structures on your property. (Note: It is possible that corrections might require a Building Permit.)

High Grass



The City Code states that your property shall be maintained and that the grass and nuisance weeds shall not exceed ten (10) inches in height.

Junk and Debris



In maintaining your property, you are to make sure it remains clear of any and all debris and junk. Your yard is to be kept clean and sanitary.

PARKING AND STORING YOUR RV!

►Recreation Vehicles (RV's) may be parked anywhere on your property for 36 hours. RV's may also be temporarily parked on the driveway in the front yard of the principal structure for trip preparations, loading, unloading, and cleanup for the maximum 36 hours per week. RV's shall have a current tag and the wastewater line caps shall be secured. ►RV's shall not be parked or stored within a street or public right-of-way. ►RV's shall not be connected to water, sewer, or electric lines or be used for residential purpose, except in a recreational vehicle park. After 36 hours, RV's must be parked behind the front most part of the home from the street side. (If you live on a corner lot, you will have two (2) street sides.)

NEIGHBORHOOD HAM WATCH

Neighborhood Ham Watch is a voluntary program for all amateur radio operators who want to provide a helpful service to their neighbors during times of extended power outage. When the power goes out for long periods of time, such as after a major storm, and everybody's batteries wear out and their generators run out of fuel, people are virtually left in the dark without any way to receive radio or television or to talk to friends and relatives outside the affected area. It gets lonely and you feel isolated because you can't talk to anyone and you can't find out what Emergency Managers in local governments are planning or doing to help you. "Communication Isolation" can be worsened by downed trees and power lines which make it very difficult for emergency services to reach your neighborhood. This is a time period that often lasts several days, maybe even weeks. It is a time when Amateur Radio Operators can help.
