US Coast Guard Auxiliary **BOATING SAFETY COURSE - NEW BOATING SAFETY** **REQUIREMENTS**

Florence K. Little Town Hall, 12 Colomba Road

Effective January 1, 2010 in the **State of Florida**, “Boat operators who were born on or after January 1, 1988 must pass an approved Boater Safety Course and have in his or her possession photographic identification and boating identification card.”

The US Coast Guard Auxiliary is offering a **BOATING SAFETY COURSE** approved by the State of Florida. The Boating Safety Course can be completed in three (3) short evenings at a total cost of \$20.

6 to 9 PM Tuesday, May 15th Wednesday, May 16th Thursday, May 17th

Upon passing the Boating Safety Course, you will receive a **Boaters Identification Card** issued by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission to operate any motor boat of 10 HP or more. To operate a PWC (Jet Ski), one must be 14 years or older. Photo identification will be required to register; either driver’s license, school ID or passport. FREE MEDICAL SHARPS PROGRAM **AT DeBARY AND ORANGE CITY FIRE STATIONS.**

Medical Sharps are hypodermic needs; insulin, injectable medications, lancets used to prick fingers to test blood, etc. PLEASE DO NOT place Sharps in your household garbage or recycling bin. Fire Services operates a free Sharps disposal program for residents of Orange City and DeBary. One-gallon Sharps containers can be obtained at the DeBary Fire Station #33, located at the corner of S. US Highway 17/92 & Colomba Road and at the Orange City Fire Station #67 located at 215 North Holly Avenue. Residents may drop off needles and diabetic testing strips in the approved red Sharps containers at the Fire Stations. This program is for Sharps from private households only.

PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT OF OUR CITY

Use Garden and Lawn Chemicals wisely, following package directions and only use pesticides, herbicides and fertilizers when other methods fail. Do not apply if rain is in the forecast. **WHY?** Excessive fertilizers and chemicals will wash off the property and into surface and ground waters.

It is recommended that you review City Ordinance #04-09 for fertilizer regulations within the City. **WHY?** To be informed regarding City regulations related to the application of fertilizers to lawns and turfs, restrictions on fertilizers containing phosphorus and nitrogen, restrictions in rates of fertilizer application, etc.

Use Compost Grass, Leaves and Shrub Clippings as mulch to supplement fertilizers. Do not rake these materials into roadways or swales. **WHY?** Grass, leaves and shrub clippings will decompose, returning nutrients to the soil so that you can use less fertilizer. If placed in roads or swales, yard debris will block drainage flows and end up in the nearest water bodies.

Shop wisely and buy products labeled biodegradable, non-toxic, non-phosphorus or water soluble. **WHY?** These products readily decompose and will not pollute surface or ground waters.

Do not drain used motor oil into storm drains. Take used motor oil to service stations or to AutoZone. **WHY?** Motor oil and antifreeze are toxic and add pollutants to surface waters if placed or washed into storm drains.

LITTER LAW

The DeBary Code of Ordinances incorporates provisions of F.S. 403.413, the Florida Litter Law. Violations of said law may be subject to the enforcement provisions of this article. Florida Statutes Chapter 403.413 defines illegal dumping and littering as a crime and punishable by up to a \$5,000 fine and/or five (5) years in prison.

COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM CLASS – Free to DeBary Residents

Schedule: 6 PM to 9 PM on Mondays, June 4, 11, 18, 25 and July 2, 9, 16

► Personnel from the Sheriff's Office and Fire Services will be conducting the classes.

FREE Training to give critical support to families and neighbors until help arrives is available to DeBary Residents in the 7-class program offered by the City of DeBary. Classes will include effects of chemical, nuclear, biological and terrorism attacks. **NOW** is the time to learn skills that could save lives and property. In a disaster, Residents could be responsible for their own safety and care for as long as 3 days or longer due to fire services, law enforcement and medical services, known as First Responders, not being available because of blocked roads, communication failures or number of victims. The Program's 7 classes consist of training in basic disaster response skills, such as basic medical aid, fire safety and putting out small fires, light search and rescue, organizing themselves and bystanders into teams, managing utilities and, of major importance, collecting disaster intelligence to support emergency services.

The Attendees will be trained as a Team and will focus on Search & Rescue, basic medical treatment and team organization. In the event of a disaster, when outside help does arrive, the Team will be in a position to provide significant information to First Responders and to support their efforts. Every Trainee who completes the course will receive a Certificate stating that they are a member of a Community Emergency Response Team. In addition, each of the new members will receive a protective helmet, a heavy duty backpack with work gloves and medical gloves, emergency heat blanket and whistle, goggles, adjustable wrench, flashlight, tape and first aid kit to be used in the event of a disaster. STEPS TO TAKE BEFORE A HURRICANE STRIKES

●BOARD up all windows and glass doors with plywood or close hurricane shutters. ●CHECK BATTERIES for flashlights and portable radios to ensure they are fresh - have extra batteries. ●STOCK UP ON NON-PERISHABLE FOOD. A 3-7 day supply of food/water for each family member is a MUST. Remember to have needed medications. ●LISTEN TO THE MEDIA FOR LOCAL EMERGENCY INFORMATION. ●IF ADVISED TO SHELTER IN PLACE: (1) Take the family disaster supply kit, (2) go to an interior "safe" room, if possible, and (3) Stay in the safe room and listen to the media for additional instructions. ●STAY AWAY FROM FLOOD WATERS. If the home begins to flood, go to a higher level, if possible. ►► STAY COMPLETELY AWAY FROM DOWNED POWER LINES. ►► TURN OFF UTILITIES, IF NECESSARY. If there is a gas smell or a fire, turn off the gas valve. IF YOU TURN THE GAS OFF, ONLY THE GAS COMPANY CAN RESTORE THE GAS SERVICE. DO NOT ATTEMPT TO DO THIS YOURSELF. Unplug appliances. If there is damage to electric lines or supply, shut off the electricity by FIRST turning off small circuit breakers (or unscrewing fuses), then turn off the main breaker (or fuse).
