## New City Council Members Take Office; City Thanks Outgoing Members for Service

Two new and one re-elected City Council member took the oath of office at the January 7, 2015 City Council meeting. The new members, Clint Johnson and Mike Brady, and incumbent Lita-Handy Peters were sworn in by City Clerk Stacy Tebo. The Council voted unanimously to appoint Lita Handy-Peters as Vice Mayor. Departing Council Member Sid Vihlen Jr. and Vice Mayor Dan Hunt each received a plaque of appreciation for service to the community.



### Council Member Mike Brady

Mike and his wife Betty have been married 36 years and are the parents of three children. They resided in Charlotte, North Carolina prior to moving to DeBary in 2000. Mike was a volunteer coach for girls and boys soccer, baseball and softball teams while living in Charlotte and the suburb of Matthews. His interests in DeBary continue to revolve around recreational and sporting activities.

Mike's volunteer experience in DeBary began with the Volusia County Public Library. He has also served on the DeBary Charter Review Committee and the Planning and Zoning Commission prior to serving on City Council. Mike holds a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from the University of North Carolina.

DeBary reminds Mike of the small town in North Carolina where he was raised. People knew, cared about, and helped each other and took pride in their community. Both he and his wife very much like living in DeBary and consider it a special place.

Mike believes DeBary will continue to attract new families and quality of life issues such as safety, taxes and recreational opportunities will be very important to those families. Growth is inevitable for DeBary and Mike would like to see growth that conforms to our community vision, benefits the city and which residents can be proud.

# West Side Emergency Flood Management System Updates

## Lakeside Gravity Outfall System - Phase II

The DeBary, Lakeside Gravity Outfall System - Phase II, stormwater improvement project is making very good progress and is on schedule for completion in March 2015. Construction operations are underway at several sites within the neighborhoods of Kings Lake, Terra Alta and DeBary Golf and Country Club.



### Kings Lake

Two concrete drainage channels or weirs were constructed to allow the passage of excess water from Kings Lake to Lower Lake. Joining the lakes is necessary to restore the natural and historic flow of stormwater within the drainage basin. Connection of the lakes provides the Kings Lake neighborhood with increased protection from flooding by utilizing the DeBary West Side Emergency Flood Management System. The West Side stormwater pumping system automatically controls the high water level of all connected water bodies.

### Terra Alta

The Lakeside Phase II project is in progress in the Terra Alta neighborhood along Florence Boulevard. The work in Terra Alta consists of installing stormwater piping and pump connection equipment enabling the City to remove excess stormwater from the drainage areas along Florence Boulevard. Residents in the Terra Alta neighborhood should expect construction operations along Florence Boulevard throughout January and February 2015.



### DeBary Golf and Country Club - LaCreek Court and Quail Hill Drive



The Lakeside Phase II project also includes the construction of an extensive underdrain system to mitigate consistently wet conditions experienced by residents on LaCreek Court and Quail Hill Drive in the DeBary Golf and Country Club. Clearing of vegetation is underway in the wooded area near DeBary Plantation Boulevard, as shown on the left. Construction is expected to be completed in February 2015.

The Lakeside Gravity Outfall System - Phase II project is scheduled for completion March 31, 2015 at a construction cost of \$602,521.94. The Contractor of the project is Ovation Construction Company.

## Road Resurfacing to Begin Next Month

The DeBary Street Resurfacing project is expected to begin in February 2015. The City of DeBary awarded the street improvement project to Preferred Materials, Inc. of Kissimmee. The 60 day project will be completed in April 2015. Street resurfacing is planned for the following DeBary roadways: West Highbanks from Donald E. Smith to the CSX Railroad crossing, Alicante from Naranja to Valencia, Naranja from East Highbanks to Colomba, South Pine Meadow from Quiet Meadow to Pine Side, Alexandra Woods from South Pine Meadow to James Pond, Wisteria from Dogwood to Narcissus, Jasmine from Wisteria to Bougainvillea, Toms Road from Mansion to the end of Toms Road, Wentwood from Englenook to Forest Eagle, Bonita from Bass Lake to Floridana, Bonita from Plumosa to Amigos, Eldorado from Matanzas to Delmar and Knightsbridge from North Pine Meadow to cul-de-sac.

## Ham Radio Group Provides the DeBary EOC with Emergency Communications

When the DeBary Emergency Operations Center (EOC) is activated during times of local emergencies, licensed Amateur Radio operators provide communications services. The network includes the Volusia County EOC, DeLand EOC, Edgewater EOC and mobile units.

The Indian Mound Amateur Radio Society (IMARS) [<http://imars.x10.mx/>] supports this effort and holds informal fellowship meetings each Monday at the DeBary EOC in the DeBary Town Hall from 10:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. Many start gathering after

9:00 a.m. for coffee, doughnuts and fellowship. Meetings include programs of general interest from time to time, not all directly related to Amateur Radio. Regular attendees are from DeBary, Deltona, Sanford, Deland, Orange City and elsewhere.

Anyone interested in learning about Amateur Radio or the EOC in general may drop by for coffee any Monday morning. Local Hams are invited to stop by to meet new Ham friends and check out the Ham Radio equipment at the EOC.



## Staff Spotlight - Deanna Hutchinson



Accounting Clerk Deanna Hutchinson is responsible for a variety of clerical and accounting tasks at the City of DeBary, including processing cash receipts, disbursements and payables daily, correspondence, and maintenance of account records and files.

Deanna began employment with the City of DeBary in October 2004 as an office assistant.

At that time, city hall was located at 137 S. Hwy 17-92 and staff was comprised of only six other full-time employees – the city manager, administrative assistant, finance administrator, city planner, volunteer coordinator, parks director, and office assistant. She was promoted to accounting clerk upon the expansion of the finance department in 2009.

During the last ten years, Deanna has seen many changes in the city including the building of the new city hall where administrative employees work in one building instead of three separate ones. She has observed a number of changes in the city including the adoption of additional ordinances, the commencement of many storm water

projects, and the city assume the responsibilities for various services that were previously performed by Volusia County.

Deanna has seen her share of city and community coming together for a common cause. She became a city employee shortly after the third hurricane to hit Central Florida in 2004 occurred, and was here in 2008 for tropical storm Fay, which devastated parts of DeBary. She was also in the thick of things when smaller tropical storms slammed the area in other years. She recalls that city employees were on-call during the storms, so she, along with other employees and residents, manned seven phone lines, filled sandbags, manned pumps, coordinated debris removal, and assisted in evacuations during the massive storms and ensuing flooding.

“It takes a lot of team players to run a city,” she said.

Deanna is a single mother of two children, both of whom she put through college. In her free time, Deanna likes to camp, boat, kayak, ride bicycles, spend time with friends, and enjoy life.

She plans to retire in 2016 and anticipates traveling the United States as well as volunteering for local service organizations.

## Volunteer Spotlight - Rick McBride

Both of Rick McBride’s claims to fame in DeBary require him to utilize the same skills, which include planning and organization, effective communication, analysis and evaluation, keeping an open mind and creating a safe environment. As a successful real estate broker, McBride has to rely heavily on these skills. They have also served him well in 25 years of coaching sports.

Rick began coaching sports while living in Sterling, Virginia and continued his love of coaching by immediately becoming involved in Little League when he and his family moved to DeBary in 2004. He has been the official League Administrator of the DeBary Babe Ruth for the last year but has unofficially been performing the duties for the past ten years for Little League. (Little League changed charter to Babe Ruth in 2014.)

In his role, Rick oversees the entire operation like a CEO. His duties include registration, collecting forms, organizing teams by age, evaluation of participants for teams, running drafts to spread the talent equally between teams and create team schedules. He also coaches three regular teams, on which 3 of his children participate.

Babe Ruth encourages a balance of community-based activities though ball by providing ball playing activities for local teams of boys and girls age 4 to 18 through various divisions of softball and baseball. He explained there are two divisions during regular season for recreational fun where all children may participate regardless of skill level. DeBary league teams took five district championships and took second place in the state last year.

“We have been blessed with a lot of talent in the DeBary area,” Rick said.

Rick also coaches an Xtreme team. He explained that Xtreme tournament teams are composed of players at a higher level of competition. Last year, Coach Sarah Yokey’s team placed ninth in the World Series championship in Massachusetts.

“I have seen Rick give up his time to promote youth activities in the City of DeBary as much or more than any individual residing here,”

said Parks and Recreation Director John Fletcher. “Rick volunteers several hundred hours every year to keep the league fees as inexpensive as possible by doing several fundraisers.”

Rick and his wife Kelly have five children ages 10-30 and will become first-time grandparents in July. When looking to relocate, Rick and his family tried to find a new home in a community similar to the one they had in the suburb of District of Columbia, and began looking in the Lake Mary area but found what they were looking for in DeBary.

“The schools are great here,” he said. “DeBary is a nice community, the parks are beautiful, the city is a very well run city and has a good Little League program.”

He also likes the people in DeBary and how the community supports itself and enjoys the central location between the attractions in Orlando and the beach.

“Rick has had a positive impact on the city and he is one of many citizens within the city of DeBary who truly cares about the community he lives in,” said Parks Superintendent Tom VanDeHey. “There have been many situations Rick was highly instrumental in completing, including the batting cages and hitting stations at Keller and Sullivan Parks and shade covers for the bleachers at Sullivan Park. He is a born leader and organizer.”

Rick appreciates the City Parks and Recreation Department for making his job easy and is thankful for great relationships he has with city staff.

“John (Fletcher) and Tom (VanDeHey) are amazing and (Recreation Coordinator) Jason (Schaitz) runs great programs, he said. “I have great relationships with all of them.”

Rick’s long-term dedication to youth sports and the community were recognized last year when he became the recipient of the Volusia League of Cities Distinguished Service Award for Community Sports.


