Ready, Set, Grow!

By the time this edition has reached your hands the TOD Market Feasibility Study will be finalized and unveiled; the TOD Master Plan will have been presented to the Mayor and City Council; and the City will have begun to implement some of the tasks set forth in both. While it will take some time and a lot of hard work behind the scenes before visually observable signs appear, the stage has been set for the proper growth we all desire for DeBary to take place. We are moving forward!

There have been increased interests in the DeBary TOD area and surrounding properties in the form of new proposals for residential communities very near the SunRail Station/ TOD Overlay area. The City has also purchased certain properties within the TOD overlay area that will be used to implement planning and encourage new developments within the TOD Overlay area.

Looking ahead into the New Year and new beginnings in DeBary, you will begin to notice we have some very nice new businesses moving into our City.

FDOT is well into the planning and permitting of the DeBary SunRail parking lot addition, which will add approximately 200 more parking spaces. The construction is planned to begin in the spring of 2016. These additional parking spaces will be located just south of the existing parking area.

The Spring to Spring bike paths additions are now under construction coming from Orange City to the northern DeBary boundary. Efforts are underway to expedite planning and completion of this trail system to Gemini Springs and of course to our SunRail Station. FDOT is also in the planning stages of connecting the trail system from Seminole County into DeBary, and it is possible that we could see construction of this southern connection in 2016.

DeBary is very uniquely situated at the crossroads of incredible opportunities for growth and enjoyment of wonderful natural resources and trail connections to the Spring to Spring Trail, East Central Regional Rail Trail, Cross Seminole Trail and soon to be completed Lake Monroe Loop Trail, in addition to the St. Johns River, SunRail Commuter rail and so much more. DeBary residents live in an area that enables us to enjoy things that many from around the world only are able to see and enjoy while on vacation. That is something to think about!

City Adds New Division to Maintain Stormwater Infrastructure

The City of DeBary Stormwater Division was recently established to inspect, repair and maintain the City of DeBary stormwater infrastructure system. Stormwater runoff is rain water that flows over impervious or pervious surfaces during and after rain. Stormwater runoff is moved or controlled by both natural and constructed systems, and these systems can be one structure or multiple structures linked together. Runoff flows to the lowest level of land or into a waterbody such as a lake or pond, but along the way some of the runoff will drain or percolate into the ground or evaporate into the air. Runoff can also be directed into constructed structures such as pipes or ditches.

The City of DeBary Stormwater Division is tasked with maintaining 104 pipe ends, 122 control structures, 1,097 curb inlets, 1,260 ditch bottom inlets, 209 headwalls, 476 manhole covers, 301 mitered end sections, 64.3 miles of culverts, 29.9 miles of open channels and 12 miles of force main. The five man crew also maintains nine Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) retention ponds and 39 city retention ponds which equates to 166.20 acres of land.

Part of the equipment utilized by the crew is a K2 portable mainline closed circuit television inspection camera. The wireless controlled camera and transporter is controlled by an integrated hand-held controller with a built in video overlay unit. The system is portable and provides 1,000 feet of video capabilities with a DVR-SD digital video recorder.



Stormwater Infrastructure Systems Improvements Update

DeBary is continuing to improve its stormwater infrastructure systems. Construction of the Small Scale Stormwater Improvement Project No. 2 is on schedule for a January 2016 completion. The overall project is a combination of eight separate projects at various locations that are combined under one contract in order to minimize administrative costs and maximize efficiency of construction resources.

Localized flooding has consistently occurred in some of the neighborhoods along Shell Road. The 54/58 Shell Road Project and the 44 Seminole Drive Project are designed to mitigate flooding concerns in this area. Stormwater construction along Shell Road and Seminole Drive required deep excavations in the roadway that necessitated daily traffic detours and lane closures.



Restoration of the Shell Road pavement remains to be completed with new striping and pavement markings to be installed in



January 2016. The affected sections of Shell Road and Seminole Drive have been previously considered for overall paving improvements under the City's annual resurfacing project. However, these paving improvements had been withheld pending completion of the stormwater project. With the stormwater work complete, the City may include an asphalt overlay of Shell Road, from Catalina Drive to Azalea Drive, and Seminole Drive from Shell Road to Pinedale Road, in a future paving improvement project.

No Name Lake Stormwater Pump Station and Force Main Project – Bid No. 06-15

The City of DeBary has advertised for bids to construct a stormwater pump station to automatically control the high water level of No Name Lake in central DeBary. Historically, No Name Lake has overtopped its banks numerous times requiring closure of Highbanks Road. The project is expected to be completed by the summer of 2016 in order to provide an additional safeguard to the City for the hurricane season.

New Home Construction Permits Increase Significantly

The number of new single-family homes permitted and built in DeBary increased 39.2% in 2015 to 39. Twenty-eight single-family homes were permitted and built in 2014.

Staff Spotlight—Steve McLaughlin

Neighborhood Improvement Officer Steve McLaughlin, who began employment with the City of DeBary in early December, has been working in municipal code enforcement since May 2013.

Under the direct supervision of the Growth Management Director, the City's Neighborhood Improvement Officer performs duties related to investigation and enforcement of building and property maintenance code functions. Duties are of a regulatory nature and related to codes established by laws for public safety, uniformity and sanitation.

Steve is responsible for conducting visual inspections of properties suspected of violating building and/or property maintenance codes in the city, photographing and documenting all violations observed. He also conducts research for investigative work relating to code cases, makes recommendations for assessments or fines and may issue notifications and citations to property owners/banks as well as implement and discuss a plan of action as required.

Steve holds a certification through the Florida Association of Code Enforcement including Level 1, "Fundamentals of Code Enforcement" and is scheduled to complete Level 3 in April 2016.

Steve believes that, "Code Enforcement in DeBary offers a variety of opportunities such as protecting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens through the application of city codes and ordinances." In these opportunities, Steve aims to gain compliance by working with citizens and affording them time to correct a violation and educate them on future concerns.

"Voluntary compliance is the ultimate goal of the Neighborhood Improvement Division," he said. "Compliance is best obtained by educating and speaking with the citizens in a polite and professional manner. It is also important to be compassionate and understanding of each individual's situation. I am looking forward to meeting many of the citizens of DeBary and helping to keep the city looking clean and maintain/improve property value."

Contact Information for Streetlight Maintenance and Downed Power Lines

Duke Energy maintains numerous outdoor lights to help promote safety and security in public areas. You should contact Duke Energy if an outdoor light or streetlight is out or not working properly. You can report a Streetlight Outage on-line at: www.duke-energy.com/streetlightrepair.

If you encounter a downed line, the first rule of safety is not to touch a power line or anything touching a power line, such as tree limbs, tools and toys. Never touch downed power lines or use any object to move power lines, including brooms, boards, limbs or plastic materials. Although wood is non-conductive, if even slightly wet, it will conduct electricity, causing electric shock or electrocution. Power lines can also slide down such objects when lifted. While it is helpful to tell Duke Energy about downed lines, do not go looking for damage. This is unnecessary and dangerous. Duke Energy will find and repair the damage as quickly as possible. If there is a hazardous condition such as a wire hanging low or lying on the ground, please call Duke Energy immediately at **800.343.3525**.

When is a Permit Necessary?

Someone just reported me to Code Enforcement and the Neighborhood Enforcement Officer came out and gave me a notice that said I needed to get a permit to install my shed. I went to the City of DeBary Building Department, **and you know what**, they charged me double for the permit fee **plus** an additional \$100.00 administrative fee.

How was I supposed to know that I needed a permit? It's on my property and the store where I bought the shed didn't say I needed one. Why do I need a permit anyway?

I called the City and found out it's the property owner's responsibility to make sure from the Zoning Department that they are not infringing on any easements or right-of-ways. The Building Inspector has to make sure the shed is tied down properly. If a hurricane or a real strong gust of wind happened, the shed might fly away and destroy property.



I was also advised that my property insurance company would be checking up if that happened to make sure I had a permit. Who knew?

When I asked the Building Department what else needed a permit, I was told a water heater, air conditioner, any plumbing or electrical that was being changed, a re-roof, windows and exterior doors, driveways and the list goes on.

If you're not sure whether a permit is needed, call the Building Department at 386-668-2040 ext. 320. It may save you worry and money.


