Help Name DeBary's New Park



This is your opportunity to suggest a name for your community's newest Park. The Park is a 100-acre triangular-shaped property that abuts the St. Johns River for a distance of about 2300 feet on its south side and will provide public access to the natural environment of the St. Johns River. The City plans to create a new outdoor conservation and recreation area in the form of a passive waterfront park, with family picnic shelters, fishing pier, playground, and nature walks with interpretive signs describing natural communities and habitats. A wide variety of birds inhabit the area, such as the egret shown above. Clusters of live oak, southern magnolia, cypress, sweetgum, and slash pine are interspersed with areas of open pasture.

The Park will be open from February 1st until February 28th for residents to view each day from 7:30 AM to 3:30 PM. The Park will officially open in late Spring 2007.

NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENT

Parking regulations are an important aspect of Neighborhood Improvement. Following are the rules for parking your vehicle within the City:

- Parking is not allowed on the grass.
- You must either park in your driveway or extend your driveway with 6" stabilized rock, bark, mulch, asphalt, etc.
- All vehicles must have a valid registration and be "road ready." If your vehicle does not have a valid tag, it must be stored in a garage.

The City of DeBary, as well as all of Central Florida, has been plagued lately with motor vehicle burglaries. Over the past several weeks, many City residents have had their belongings removed from their cars during the night. In almost 100% of these cases, the cars were left unlocked by their owners.

The thieves walk down the streets in the middle of the night, and pull on the door handles of the cars on the streets and in the driveways. If the door opens, they enter the car and take everything that they can find and carry.

The City of DeBary's extremely low crime rate does not mean you should ignore safety. Be sure to secure your home and vehicles at all times. **LOCK YOUR CAR.** And don't leave expensive valuables in plain view in your vehicles. Remember, "IT CAN HAPPEN HERE."
