How Prepared are You for This Year's Hurricane Season?

Attending the 2010 STORM PREPAREDNESS EXPO will help you prepare.

Hurricane season begins June 1st, but Disasters can strike anywhere at any time. Do you have an action plan - Does your family know the plan? Do you have your important papers together - Is your insurance up to date - Do you need flood insurance? Do you know how to get up-to-date information? Can you help during a disaster - Do you know where to go to offer or to get assistance? Safety Coordinator Alan Williamson will discuss the City's Emergency Operations Center.

FLORIDA LAWS ON CONSUMER FIREWORKS

■ **SPECIFICALLY PROHIBITED:** Firecrackers, torpedoes, skyrockets, roman candles, and daygo bombs, and any fireworks containing explosive or flammable compounds.

■ **SPECIFICALLY PERMITTED:** Devices that emit a shower of sparks upon burning, do not contain any explosive compounds, do not detonate or explode, are hand-held or ground-based, cannot propel themselves through the air, and that contain no more than 100 grams of the chemical compound that produces sparks upon burning. Snakes, small smoke devices, trick noisemakers and certain other novelties are also allowed.

According to the State Fire Marshal’s Office, anyone using fireworks must have a permit from their local government or for certain agricultural purposes be exempted by law. It is illegal in Florida to use fireworks, which include: shells and mortars, multiple tube devices, Roman candles, rockets and firecrackers, when such use is not in strict compliance with Chapter 791.012, Florida Statutes. Floridians should not sign “waivers” in order to purchase fireworks. Signing a waiver will not clear you of responsibility should you be caught illegally using fireworks, which is a first-degree misdemeanor punishable by up to one (1) year in jail and a \$1,000 fine.

ITEMS FOR YOUR DISASTER SUPPLY KIT

Water - Store at least a 3 to 7-day supply of water for each person. This means 1 gallon of water per day for each person. Children, nursing mothers, and ill people will need more than one gallon each day. Replace stored water every 6 months.

Food – Store at least a 3-day supply of non-perishable food – foods that require no refrigeration, no preparation or cooking and little or no water. Ready-to-eat meats / fruits / vegetables – Pack a non-electric can opener. Canned juices / food for infants and food for the elderly / snack foods / paper plates / cups / plastic utensils. Replace stored food every 6 months.

Blankets / Pillows, etc. – 1 complete change of clothing / footwear / rain gear/ sturdy shoes.

First Aid Kit & Manual / Medicines / Prescription Drugs - Special Items for babies and the elderly / Toiletries / Hygiene items / moisture wipes / aspirin / anti-diarrhea medication / laxative / disinfectant / denture needs / extra eye glasses / plastic bucket with tight lid. **Important documents** – Keep in a waterproof container or watertight re-sealable plastic bag - insurance / medical records / will / bank account numbers / Social Security cards, etc.

Battery-operated radio and a NOAA weather radio - Flashlight / Batteries (check exp. date) / Fully-charged cell phone with extra battery and a traditional (not cordless) telephone set / Important phone numbers / Emergency Preparedness Manual / Cash (with some small bills in a waterproof container) and Credit Cards (Banks and ATMs may not be available for extended periods) – All Keys - house, car, safe deposit box. Map of the area (for locating shelters). Tools/shovel - keep a set with you during the storm / Vehicle fuel tanks filled.

Toys, Books, and Games - **Pet care items:** proper identification / immunization records / medications / ample supply of food and water / a carrier or cage / muzzle and leash.

VOLUSIA COUNTY EMERGENCY PUBLIC INFORMATION STATIONS

In an emergency, the following stations will release information and instructions via the following news outlets: WNDB 1150 AM, WHOG 95.7 FM, WKRO 93.1 FM and WVYB 103.3 FM. To watch Channel 15, turn your television to UHF channel 15 or consult your cable television listings.

WATERING RESTRICTIONS

Watering restrictions apply to all County residents, including those living in cities.

Watering is Not allowed between 10 AM and 4 PM.

During Daylight Saving Time, watering is allowed from 4 PM to 10 AM

Residential ODD-numbered addresses may water on Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Residential EVEN-numbered addresses may water on Thursdays and Sundays.

•Businesses may irrigate from 4 PM to 10 AM on Tuesdays and Fridays.

During Eastern Standard Time, watering is allowed from 4 PM to 10 AM

Residential ODD-numbered addresses may water on Saturdays Only.

Residential EVEN-numbered addresses may water on Sundays Only.

•Businesses may irrigate from 4 PM to 10 AM on Tuesdays Only.

Irrigation is limited to no more than one (1) Hour and 3/4" of Water per Zone per Irrigation Day. Restrictions apply to all water sources, including private wells and pumps, ground or surface water, and water from public and private utilities. New plantings may be watered at any time for 30 days, then every other day for another 30 days. Keep the store receipt for proof of purchase. Hand watering is allowed any time with an automatic shut-off on the hose.

Watering-in of chemicals is allowed any time within 24 hours of application and may not exceed 1/4" quarter-inch of water. Automatic landscape irrigation systems, regardless of the date of installation, must be equipped with functional rain-sensing devices or soil-moisture sensors. Agricultural uses are exempt from the provisions of the Water Conservation Ordinance, as long as they follow the agricultural water conservation requirements of the St. Johns River Water Management District.

Gather your family and friends and plan a few hours at the St. Johns River to help maintain and beautify the River.

A few suggestions - Wear comfortable clothing and closed-toed shoes and bring work gloves. Rakes, shovels, and trash grabbers may be helpful but not necessary. ►Steps should be taken for protection from the Sun. ►Bring bottled water. The local cleanup sites will be Lake Monroe Park in DeBary, Lake Monroe Boat Ramp – 980 Lakeshore Drive in Deltona, Lemon Bluff Boat Ramp - 907 Lemon Bluff Road in Osteen, and French Avenue Boat Launch at Starks Landing where French Avenue meets the St. Johns River in Orange City.
